Autumn 1 (Sep – Oct) Paper 1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Unit 1: English Language Paper 1, Section A ➤ Introduction to course/overview for Paper 1 to be communicated to pupils. ➤ Using explicit and implicit evidence to support ideas (Question 1, Paper 1) ➤ Finding relevant details within a text; ➤ Writing about language techniques in literature (Question 2, Paper 1); ➤ Commenting on structure using the medium of film – teach FIND SCRIPTS acronym to assist analysis (Question 3, Paper 1);
Autumn 2 (Nov-Dec) Paper 1	<p>Unit 1: English Language Paper 1, Section A:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Finish teaching Question 3, Paper 1 using film texts and a range of literary texts and then focus on Question 4, Paper 1.
Spring 1 (Jan-Feb) Paper 1	<p>Unit 1: English Language Paper 1, Section A:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Finish teaching Question 3, Paper 1 using film texts and a range of literary texts and then focus on Question 4, Paper 1 and teach critical evaluation.
Spring 2 (Mar-Apr) Paper 1	<p>Unit 3: Paper 1, Section B (focusing on writing to describe)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Planning a description; ➤ Describing a person, place and an event using pictures and the moving image as stimulus.
Summer 1 (Apr – May) Paper 2	<p>Unit 4: Paper 1, Section B (writing to narrate).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Planning a story; ➤ Openings – how to begin a story and vary your structural features to interest a reader; ➤ Writing key passages in the story; ➤ Endings; ➤ Creating characters;
Summer 2 (June – July)	Unit 5: Spoken Language controlled assessment to be recorded. requirements, types of activities, grading, watching students online present.
